GREEDY (to be) gu-sahagura  
(for a certain food and want that  
only) ku-nohorwa

GREEN ak-ātsi gatoto  
(unripe, of certain fruits) -toto  
(to become green, as grass when  
rains begin) gu-tōha,  
gu-totahara

GREEN BEAN umu-bimba,  
umu-konyogo, umu-kerere

GREENS in-yabutongo, ubg-ākara,  
im-bgija, im-boga

GREET (by oneself in person)  
ku-ramutsa  
(for) gu-tahiriza  
(for another) gu-tāsha  
(one another) ku-ramūkanya

GREETING in-damukanyo

GREETINGS (to bring, bear)  
gu-tāsha  
(to send) ku-ganūka, kuganūtsa

GRIEF umu-babaro, ama-ganya,  
aga-hīnda  
(to be in) ku-ganya, ku-ganyira  
(to torment oneself with)  
kw-īyambagura

GRIEVE (vi) gu-tuntura  
(over) gu-tunturirwa

GRIEVED (to be) kw-iganyira,

GRIMACE ku-nyinyirwa

GRIND gu-sya, gu-kwema, ku-noza  
(in wooden mortar) gu-sekura  
(poorly, coarsely) gu-hera  
(quickly) gu-kwemagura  
(to crush grain before grinding)  
ku-vūngurīsha

GRINDING in-sya  
(stone) uru-syo, i-rtyazo  
(of teeth) insya z'amenyo

GRIPE kw-īdōga

GRIT (teeth) gu-kōmanya,  
ku-zyēgenya  
(to avoid showing pain)  
gu-shinyanga, gu-shinyiriza

GROAN umu-niho  
(to groan) ku-niha

GROUND (on the) hasi  
(dug up but not planted) ama-sinde  
(to put on) gu-tereka  
(to throw stick on g. and it tumbles  
end over end) ku-birika

GROUP umu-ce, umu-co, igi-co  
(of people) in-tēko  
(of people, moving along) aka-vuvu  
(standing or sitting) aka-rwi  
(to be in large g., cows or people  
standing) gu-sagaza

GROW gu-kura, kw-āruka, gu-kaka  
(after cutting) ku-naga  
(larger, esp. moon) gu-tūbūka  
(let hair grow long) gu-tongoza  
(old) gu-tāma  
(rapidly in spurts) ku-vugumuka  
(smaller, sometimes used of  
moon) gu-tūba  
(to cause to grow) gu-kuza  
(to not grow, plant) ku-nyigīra
